COVID-19 Note: The Organizing Authorities (OAs) recognize that the current situation regarding COVID-19 is fluid and may impact parts of this event, particularly the ability to hold social gatherings on land. The NOR reflects the full schedules of events, assuming no impact from COVID-19, and if there are any changes in the event schedule or the format, an OA will communicate them in a timely manner. Please see the Addendum for COVID-19 guidelines put in place by CSA as well as restrictions by Illinois authorities.

1 RULES

- 1.0 This regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in the Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS) and FSSA's Class Rules (Class Rules).
- 1.1 US Sailing prescriptions to RRS 63.2 and 63.4b will not apply.
- 1.2 Participants agree to abide by the RRS and all other rules that govern this event and the host club. Payment of the Entry Fee acknowledges agreement and consent to this paragraph.
- 1.3 **Each skipper and crew must sign a General Release and Waiver of Liability Form** prior to participation (see Addendum). This will be available for your choice in one of three ways: (1) available on-line at Regatta Network registration site to be filled out and brought in at check in, (2) down loaded from the Carlyle Sailing Association (CSA) Handbook website (<https://csa-sailing.org/resources/Members/handbook/csa-handbook.pdf>) (page 32) and sent or brought in at check in, or (3) filled out at check in.
- 1.4 **Boat owners must provide marine liability insurance** for their Flying Scot prior to participation. **The name of the insurance company and the policy number are required on the form** (see the Addendum).

2 ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 2.0 The regatta is open to Active, Life, Club and Family members of FSSA. The crew shall consist of the helmsperson and his or her spouse.
- 2.1 FSSA dues and club boat registration fees must be paid to the FSSA by the close of registration.
- 2.2 The crew shall sail a boat that one of them has registered with the FSSA, or, in the case of an FSSA Club Member, their club's registered club boat unless she/he has complied with Section 2.3.

- 2.3 Before borrowing or chartering a boat, the FSSA member must submit the Chartering and Boat Borrowing form (available on the FSSA website on the “Documents/Forms” page) and obtain approval before their entry will be accepted. Charter boats may become available on a first come first serve basis.
- 2.4 If the FSSA member co-owns the boat to be entered, she/he must submit the Co-ownership Certification Form (available on the FSSA website on the “Documents/Forms” page) and obtain approval before the boat’s entry will be accepted. The other co-owner may not enter the regatta.
- 2.5 Non-owners may request a one-time exemption to participate by emailing their reasons to the FSSA Executive Secretary at info@fssa.com at least two weeks prior to the end of registration. If approved, the non-owner must join FSSA as a Club Member by the close of registration.
- 2.6 Entrants shall select either the Championship, Challenger or Non-Spinnaker Division prior to the close of registration. The selection is subject to the approval of FSSA’s National Championships Committee.

3 REGISTRATION

- 3. Registration may be completed: 1) online at <https://csa-sailing.org/Wife-Husband> 2) online at www.fssa.com under the Upcoming Events section, or 3) at the regatta site Friday, October 2 from 1400 – 1900. Check-in is required at the regatta site during registration hours at which time Sailing Instructions and the Notice of Race will be available.

4 FEES

- 4. The entry fee is shown in the table below and includes the following for each couple: Friday Welcome Party, Saturday breakfast, lunch, refreshments after racing and dinner, Sunday breakfast, lunch and refreshments after racing. An Extra Meal Package is available which includes all of the social activities and meals listed as part of the entry fee.

6 MEASUREMENT

- 6. Boats and sails must conform to the Class Rules. All sail numbers must match the hull number, and bow bags and transom ports are required. Each boat must carry equipment required by Class

Rule, Article S-V 2. Other measurements may be made at the discretion of the Technical Committee which will be appointed by the Measurement Chair of FSSA prior to the event.

7 LAUNCHING AND BERTHING

7. There are three hoists and two launch ramps available to put boats in the water. Each boat will be assigned a dry slip space and equipment storage area in the parking lot. Each trailer shall be stored in its assigned parking space. CSA does not recommend that boats be stored in the water overnight without supervision.

8 VENUE

8. The race area is in the southern portion of Lake Carlyle.

9 THE COURSES

9. The courses to be sailed will be described in the Sailing Instructions and at a minimum will include Windward-Leeward courses.

10 SCORING

10. One race must be completed to constitute a championship.
10. No race score will be excluded. This changes RRS A2.1.
10. A boat scored TLE (Time Limit Expired) will be awarded two points more than the last boat that has sailed the course and finished within the time limit. This changes RRS A4, A4.2,
- 10.3 One race must be completed to constitute a championship.
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11 SUPPORT BOATS

11. A competitor shall not use support or spectator personnel or their equipment, including tow boats, while away from the dock unless they have been pre-approved by the Protest or Race Committee, or made available to all competitors by the Organizing Authority.

12 RADIO COMMUNICATION

12. The Race Committee may use VHF radios to communicate with competitors while racing. Channel information will be in the Sailing Instructions or communicated at the competitors' meeting. See Class Rules, Article S-V - Racing Restrictions, Paragraph 7 for more information regarding electronic equipment.

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14 PRIZES

14. Prizes will be awarded to the lesser of the first five boats in each division or the top 25% of each division. A registrant sailing under the non-owner exemption is eligible for keeper but not perpetual trophies. The following perpetual trophies will be awarded:

Championship Division 1st Place: Ted and Florence Glass Trophy

Challenger Division 1st Place: Cal and Anita Hudson Trophy

Best finish by spouses whose combined ages equal or exceed 100: Eric and Mary Ammann Trophy

Best finish by first-time team in the Wife-Husband Championship: Bob Penticoff Memorial Trophy

15 DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

15. Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk (see RRS 4 Decision to Race). Neither the organizing authority nor the host organization will accept any liability for material damage, personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with, prior to, during or after the regatta. See Rules 1.4 and 1.5.

To ensure the safety of our members and their families during the COVID 19 pandemic a number of practices will be put in place for the 2020 sailing season.

As a club organization and as individual members, Carlyle Sailing Association will follow the federal guidelines plus all state and local requirements. We ask that you please follow these guidelines:

Individual Member Responsibilities	The Club's Role
<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. If you are running a fever or experiencing other symptoms that may indicate a COVID infection, please stay home. If you have recently had such symptoms or the virus, please stay home for an extra week or until medically cleared. 2. Have in your possession at all times a face covering. These are to be worn when you may be closer than six feet away from anyone not in your immediate household. Also, these should be worn whenever you enter a building at CSA. 3. Maintain six foot social distancing so much as possible. 4. Wash your hands frequently and carry hand sanitizer with you. 5. Cover coughs or sneezes with your elbow. 6. Spread out and use our many picnic tables when you eat your lunch, etc. 7. Comply with all posted guidance. 8. If you've had close contact with a COVID infected person, please self quarantine for 14 days. 9. It is important that <u>all</u> members, their families and guests follow these practices to protect our health. Your compliance will also ensure that Illinois authorities allow CSA to open and to continue operating during the COVID-19 situation. 	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. CSA will follow public health guidelines and restrictions currently in effect by local authorities in Illinois. 2. CSA will be open to members, their guests, and to others with advance reservation for sailing activities. 3. Sanitize frequently touched surfaces on a regular basis. 4. Ample soap and paper towels will be available in the restrooms. 5. Provide a limited number of face masks available for purchase at the club. Members are strongly encouraged to bring their own face covering, 6. We will postpone, cancel or modify activities as needed to comply with detailed guidelines currently in effect. 7. We expect that many COVID-related practices will remain in place at CSA for the entire sailing season. Some of the government items may be changed or loosened by Illinois authorities during the coming months. We will keep members informed of such changes. 8. Organizers of events that involve food service will be asked to comply with current Illinois restrictions applicable to serving food.

As of May 29 and until further notice, the following restrictions are in place by Illinois authorities:

1. Boating: Up to 10 people allowed per boat with social distancing or face masks unless family. Maintain social distance on the docks/launch areas and be prepared to leave immediately if there isn't room to social distance.
2. Camping: A single family can occupy a campsite—no outside visitors. Campfires limited to only those occupying that campsite. Shower facilities are open.
3. Regattas and other competitive boating events with travel to a predetermined location and time are permitted with the restrictions outlined in this guidance. Before or after the competition, no gatherings over 10 people. Long distance travel is discouraged.

GENERAL RELEASE & WAIVER OF LIABILITY

For and in consideration of the permission to utilize the premises, facilities and equipment of the Carlyle Sailing Association (CSA) and to participate in any activities organized by or associated with the CSA, the undersigned participant(s) (the "Participant"), and if such Participant is a minor, the Participant's parent or legal guardian, and their respective heirs, executors, administrators, personal representatives and next of kin (collectively the, "Releasers"), do hereby agree and consent to the following:

1. Release. The Participant(s) do hereby RELEASE, WAIVE, DISCHARGE, and COVENANT NOT TO SUE the CSA, its affiliates, and their respective directors, officers, employees, volunteers, agents, representatives, successors and assigns (collectively, the "Released Parties"), from any and all claims, demands, damages, judgments, executions, or causes of action, present or future, known or unknown, which a Participant(s) may have, or claim to have, against any Released Party resulting from death, personal injury, property damage or other loss a Participant(s) may sustain, in any way arising out of or in connection with the Participant's use of any of the CSA's premises, facilities or equipment, or the property of any of the Released Parties (collectively, the "Property"), or the Participant's participation in any activities organized by or associated with the Released Parties whether land based activities or Sailing Activities howsoever caused, including, without limitation, THE NEGLIGENCE OF THE RELEASED PARTIES. All personal property kept, placed or left on or about the premises of the CSA or used in connection with the Sailing Activities shall be at the sole risk of the Participant(s) and the Released Parties shall have no responsibility for such loss, theft, or damage to any such personal property.

2. Assumption of Risks. The Participant(s) do hereby acknowledge and agree that (a) the USE OF THE PROPERTY AND PARTICIPATION IN THE SAILING ACTIVITIES INVOLVE THE RISK AND DANGER OF PROPERTY DAMAGE AND/OR MORTAL OR SERIOUS BODILY INJURY; (b) such risks may be caused by the actions or inactions of the Participant, the actions or inactions of others participating in the Sailing Activities, the conditions in which the Sailing Activities take place, the condition of the Property, or the negligence of the Released Parties; and (c) there may be other risks not readily foreseeable at this time. The participants further acknowledge The Racing Rules of sailing, including Rule 4, Decision to Race. THE RELEASORS FULLY ACCEPT AND ASSUME ALL SUCH RISKS and all responsibility for any losses, costs and damages incurred by the Participant(s) as a result of his/her use of the property and participation in the Sailing Activities.

3. Damages and Rules. The Participant(s) shall be responsible for all loss or damage caused by Participant's intentional, negligent, or careless use of the Property or his vessel including his or her failure to abide by all rules and instructions of the CSA or its representatives or agents relating to participation in the Sailing Activities or a breach of The Racing Rules of Sailing or rules for the avoidance of a collision.

4. Interpretation. THIS RELEASE IS INTENDED TO BE A COMPLETE AND UNCONDITIONAL RELEASE OF ALL LIABILITY (INCLUDING LIABILITY THAT ARISES OUT OF NEGLIGENCE ON THE PART OF ANY RELEASED PARTY) TO THE GREATEST EXTENT ALLOWED BY LAW. The Releasers agree that this Release and Waiver shall be governed and construed in accordance with the law of the State of Illinois. If any portion of this Release is held to be invalid, the remaining provisions shall continue in full force and effect.
